Leader in *Our Duty – Parents Advocacy Challenging Transgenderism*Topic: Male, Female, or ???? What you can and must do now!



Transgender ideation, gender dysphoria, gender identification issues and a parent's rights to know how their children as students are identifying. In the last few years these terms have become commonplace even if we aren't exactly certain of their meaning. Gender-affirming treatments and procedures, such as medical hormone intervention including body mutilation, are being routinely practiced by physicians and healthcare providers. To many of us, the fact that this policy has been achieved by stealth and is so widespread is astonishing. Many feel that to secretly

undermine the role of parents will, in the long run, be harmful to children, families, and ultimately society.

Erin Friday, Esq. is a licensed California attorney who is personally familiar with all aspects of the transgender subject. Erin is a mother of a daughter who used to believe that she was a boy. Erin is the co-lead for *Our Duty*, an international parent advocacy group and on the Board for Genspect. Erin is frequently found in Sacramento fighting bills that erode parental rights and force parents to subject their children to gender interventions and she is proposing bills that return parental rights and safeguard children.

Let's learn what we can do to effect change, to protect children from gender ideology, and what is the state of the lawsuits in California related to gender.

She enjoyed live plays like *Annie Get Your Gun* and *Peter Pan* with Mary Martin and *West Side Story*. And Symphony concerts were a favorite because the music created a peacefulness; such a peacefulness that she would often doze off. Then there were SF Giants games with pitcher Juan Marichal and days with her Grandpa. Great memories.

At Redwood High School she joined the Girls Athletic Association; played golf, racquetball, softball, speed-ball, and volleyball. She recalls a particular game-Redwood H.S. vs SF Giants. R.H.S. won 3-2. She joined the Young Republican Women's club and later the MRWF and has been a member for 60 years. In 2011- 2013 she served as Chaplain.

Not shy of an honest day's work, she worked at Pacific Bell as a Clerk in the Products Development department and delivery of the phone books. Her next employment was a change of scenery. Legislative Report

By Ruth Holly – MRWF Legislative reporter

The only voice we have is our vote! Every eligible Republican has the obligation to cast their vote! We need to eliminate the Democrat legislative supermajority in California. The state will misuse bond money. The state will misuse tax money. Vote against all state propositions that increase their funding. Vote **No** on **Proposition 5**!

Another legislative session has ended, and Governor Newsom will have decided the fate of over 800 bills by **September 30**.

Democrats appear to prefer illegals to citizens. California became the first sanctuary state in October 2017, thanks to Governor Jerry Brown and **Senate Bill 54**. Each year they provide additional benefits to illegals at our expense.

AB 1840 Home Purchase Assistance Program: Eligibility. Fortunately, Governor Newsom vetoed this controversial bill which would have extended eligibility for \$150,000 in first time home buyer assistance to illegals.

SB 227 Unemployment: Excluded Workers Program. Illegal aliens are not currently eligible for unemployment insurance. This bill requires the executive branch to develop a program providing cash assistance to unemployed illegal residents of California.

AB 2586 Public Postsecondary Education: Student Employment. Federal law prevents the hiring of illegal aliens. This bill would prevent the University of California, California State Colleges, and California Community Colleges from discriminating against students who are illegally in the country unless federal funding specifically restricts such employment.

AB 1555 Democrats want the freedom to promote their gender ideology without the interference of parents.

This bill, the Support Academic Futures and Educators for Today's Youth Act which allows school staff to hide a student's gender confusion from parents, was signed into law by Governor Newsom in July. The Huntington Beach City Council is suing the state and passed an ordinance declaring Huntington Beach a "Parent's Right to Know City."

Democrats want to control your speech as evidenced by the following three bills passed by the legislature and signed into law by Governor Newsom.
