Speaker: Colleen Britton, CALA, California Action for Legislative Accountability

Topic: “Get Your Voice Heard By Your California Legislators”



A twenty five year High School teaching career was only the beginning for Colleen. In 2010 she founded the Vaca Valley Tea Party, and for 13 years she headed the Constitution Literacy Advocates, a group that sponsored an annual Constitution Essay Contest for Solano County High School Students, awarding more than \$14,000.00 to students

Colleen has been an active volunteer with the Election Integrity Project California (EIPCa), since 2012. She served on the Board of

Directors from 2022-2023 and currently serves as the Solano County EIPCa Coordinator.

Colleen has testified before the California State Senate and Assembly Election Committee hearings on many occasions advocating for EIPCa’s position on proposed election related legislation.

In March of 2025 Colleen and a friend took a leap of faith and created **CALA, California Action for Legislative Accountability**, a new and effective way to educate California voters and effectively amplify their voice with their state representatives on critical bills at a time when it matters most—before they vote in committees.

In less than a year CALA has hundreds of volunteers and are well on their way to having CALA volunteers in all 40 Senate Districts and all 80 Assembly Districts.

SAVE America Act?

What about it?

Make phone calls now to Legislators listed at the left. Call urging them to vote YES.

"Senate Majority Leader John Thune says the Senate will take up the [SAVE Act for a vote](#) when lawmakers return to Washington next week [4th week of February 2026]. . .

If and when passed, the SAVE Act would head to [President Donald Trump's](#) desk. Once signed, it would amend the National Voter Registration Act to

require proof of citizenship - via in-person documentation - as an effort to make certain that all voters are United States citizens

[The SAVE Act](#), also called the *SAVE America Act*, would require states to obtain documentary proof-of-citizenship "in person," such as an American passport or birth certificate from anyone registering to vote for the first time in a federal election, or re-registering after they move or change their name. It was

amended from an earlier version to include Trump's demands to require voters to show photo identification in order to cast a ballot in person or send a copy when requesting and submitting their ballot for voting absentee."

Fighting Back – The Invisible Coup

"The phrase *E pluribus unum* on the U.S. seal, means, 'out of many, one.' It denotes a coming together, a melding of peoples into one. This has been the genius of America, guided by shared principles and values. But certain foreign and domestic actors don't want *unum*. They want radical political and social division to subvert our constitutional republic." That statement is from Peter Schweizer's new, widely acclaimed book, *The Invisible Coup*.

In nine chapters, Schweizer meticulously documents the events purposely engineered by elites at home and aided by adversaries abroad to cause that political and social division — and the chaos we now readily experience. He shows how mass migration has morphed into the most powerful political weapon ever aimed at the United States.

His final chapter, "Fighting Back," provides seven specific actions that we can use to counter this "invisible coup." The first: ban the practice of dual citizenship. It is certainly not for America's benefit. It means, at best, dual loyalty. Those people who sincerely desire to become US citizens should renounce their previous oaths and allegiances to other countries. This would likely require a constitutional amendment, but worth the effort.

Legislative Report

Farms and the Continuing Energy Follies of California Policy

DEI: Oppose AB 52 (Aguilar-Curry) Farmer equity: advisory committees. The Farmer Equity Act of 2017 (Aguilar-Curry) requires the California Department of Food and Agriculture to provide outreach and support to “historically” disadvantaged farmers and ranchers. This bill would establish the advisory committee in statute to prevent future administrations from disbanding the committee. The Black, Indigenous, and People of Color Producer Advisory Committee advises the CDFA on how they can promote the interests of non-white farmers. The bill also establishes a Small-Scale Producer Advisory Committee to promote the interests of smaller producers.

Energy Follies: Climate change activists and politicians promote intermittent renewable sources of energy such as wind and solar. Unfortunately, government intervention in the market has led to inadequate baseload energy in California from reliable sources such as natural gas, nuclear, geothermal, and hydroelectric power plants and an overreliance on intermittent energy sources putting grid integrity at risk. Wind turbines produce energy 20% of the time and the energy is wasted if the grid operator does not need the wind energy. Ratepayers are required by law to pay for the wind energy even if it is not needed or used. To increase the efficiency of renewable energy sources over two hundred battery plants have been built in California and over a hundred more are in the planning stages. Eight different lithium battery storage facilities in California had toxic explosions in 2024. Moisture increases the risk of battery explosions but many of these facilities have been built on the coast. California state enabled the building of the Moss Landing lithium battery storage facility with a 500-million-dollar subsidy. It was built at a former natural gas plant, on the coast of Monterey. The plant had its fourth (yes, that is 4th) and largest lithium battery explosion on January 16, 2025. A 375-foot plume containing tons of toxic material such as hydrogen fluoride and heavy metals contaminated up to fifteen miles of the surrounding area. Residents suffered from pulmonary, throat, eye, and skin irritation and risk long term side effects such as lung cancer from inhaled cobalt. The explosion was too dangerous for firefighters to combat and so the fire was allowed to burn out over the next three weeks. Microscopic carcinogenic cobalt particles were embedded in the soil at one hundred to one thousand times the natural concentration. Strawberries and avocados are grown in Monterey County. Some studies have looked at contaminants in waterways and agricultural products. Professor Michael Hogan, a physicist, thinks the studies on the contamination of local food products are inadequate.

Planned offshore wind projects require battery storage plants. Unfortunately, offshore wind is one of the costliest and most carbon intensive forms of energy over its life cycle. The turbines are produced in China using energy from coal plants. The cobalt

mining needed for the lithium batteries occurs in the Congo using child slave labor and is estimated to kill two thousand children a year. Surveying and installation of offshore wind turbines create two hundred decibels of noise which permanently deafens whales. Whales are dependent on hearing for communication and the use of sonar. Over 5900 whales have been killed in Europe. In Europe, the annual wind turbine breakage rate is 9%. The gear boxes require maintenance in boats by crew members who must climb 300-foot towers and service complex electrical equipment resulting in deaths from falls and electrocution.
