 Topic: March 5th Primary Republican Candidates -- Get Ready to Vote**



On March 5th we will have the opportunity to cast votes for the Republican candidates competing for various positions within our state. There is a Congressional seat in the D.C. Swamp with two brave Republicans vying for the opportunity to represent us. There is a contest between two Republicans for the California Assembly seat currently held by Damon Connolly.

And closer to home the Marin County Central Committee (Marin GOP) has 32 people on the Primary ballot to become a Central Committee member from the five Central Committee election districts. These districts can be fairly cut up so some of us may not even know in which district we live.

If you are not familiar with all the qualified people willing to represent the Republican Party, this is an opportunity to further identify and ask questions that are of concern to you and your family.

It is important that we use the primary elections to put the most qualified and likely to win candidate on the ballot in November. Educating ourselves on the options helps assure that result.

Election day is Tuesday, March 5th. At a Vote Center ask for a “Vote Center Ballot”. Leave your Mail-In ballot at home. Why do this? Because your vote will be counted that night and be in the reported vote count by midnight March 5th.

President's Report

Conversation between Christopher Rufo and Erik Prince, the geopolitical strategist

Excerpts from: Rufo's latest email on DEI: Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

Christopher Rufo: The United States has the individual, the ethnic group, the racial group, and then humankind, or the human universal identities. The only way out of the crisis of identity fragmentation is to create a common sense of obligation toward the country and to subordinate those middle registers of identity to the universal principles of what the Founders called the natural rights of all mankind. It's going to require the obliteration of the DEI bureaucracy across all institutions and a recommitment to a common ethos of how our country should operate.

Erik Prince: The most important thing that Republicans can do is to cut off the money. Stop funding these ridiculously bloated institutions, whether it's in education or the military. It doesn't mean spending 2 percent more next year. It means spending 20 percent less. When COVID hit, the CIA sent 80 percent of its personnel home. Because it was not a secure environment, they were basically paid to sit and do nothing. But actual intelligence collection and reporting quality went up. The next CIA director should be able to take 80 percent of the headcount out on the first weekend.

Rufo: It's the layer of useless administrative bureaucracy within all our institutions. This is the layer that is most easily exploited by ideology. Because if you can't produce good products and services in the private sector, if you can't produce good outcomes via public services in the government, your refuge—the refuge of scoundrels—is ideology.



Voter's Choice Act counties to open Vote Centers	February 24

Processed by local Post Office

Sent to Distribution Center in SF for sorting by county

↓
Sent to Post Office at Marin County Civic Center

↓
Picked up by Voter Registration Clerks

↓
Processed through Diebold machine for signature verification

↓
If signature verified, second sort by Precinct by Diebold machine

↓
Envelope sent to "I and D" to be opened

↓
If signature does not pass verification

↓
Sent for visual signature review with Clerk on machine that verifies 4 signatures at a time

↓
If signature does not clear verification, sent for hand visual review by Clerk

↓
If signature still does not pass, reviewed by Voter Registrar and Deputy Voter Registrar

↓
If questions still exist, Voter sent a letter for signature verification

↓
Verified signatures sent back through Diebold machine for 3rd sort by precinct

↓
Envelopes then opened by clerk and reviewed for completeness/rubber banded in groups of 25

↓
If no problems, put in box for Tabulation

↓
If all choices are not clearly noted, sent for machine Adjudication for "Voter Intent Review" by 2 Clerks

↓
Ballots boxed with 250 ballots and sent to Tabulation for input into electronic machine

↓
No ballot counts are released until 8 pm on election night (if they have passed the above process)

Ballots not processed by election day, and those received after election day (but date stamped by election day and received by the 17 day arrival deadline), will be processed with the above path before the certification date and within 30 days of the election.

Path of Ballots Cast at the Polling Place on Election Day

The Ballots are delivered to the Election Office and fed into a Tabulation machine on election night.

The Count is announced as soon as all ballots have been processed that came in from the Precincts on election night.

Legislative Report

Proposition 1 is the only initiative on the March 2024 ballot. This proposition supported by our state legislature and governor is 69 pages long! Opponents include the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association and the League of Women Voters of California. Carl DeMaio, chairman of Reform California states, “*At a time when we face a growing mental health crisis with homelessness, Prop 1 actually diverts existing funds from mental health treatment programs so the money can be diverted to government-financed housing projects. In doing so, Prop 1 raids and diverts funding from the very mental health treatment programs that currently serve homeless people! That’s why a bipartisan coalition of mental health treatment advocates oppose Prop 1 and warn of devastating cuts to mental health treatment programs if it passes.*”

Our Assemblyman Damon Connolly again held a “There Ought to be a Law” contest seeking constituent input. He has already sponsored several bills. **AB 1864** strengthens regulation of pesticide use within a quarter mile of public and private schools. **AB 828** protects disadvantaged communities (average income less than 80% of the statewide median) but not other communities from groundwater use restrictions imposed by state bureaucrats. **AB 1822** closes a loophole that allows misdemeanor sex offenders too incompetent to face trial to be released into the community without treatment! **AB 1790** establishes sexual allegation procedures for the California State Colleges. **AB 1778** makes it illegal for individuals younger than 16 to use a class 2 electric bike and requires the use of a helmet when using these bikes which self-propel up to speeds of 20 mph.

Did you know that **SB 1157** (Hertzberg) signed into law by Governor Newsom in 2022 despite the opposition of water districts decreases the standard indoor residential use allotment January 1, 2025, from 55 gallons to 47 gallons and then January 1, 2030, decreases it further to 42 gallons per person per day? The State Water Resources Control Board is now making rules for urban water agencies to further their goal of “Making Conservation a California Way of Life.” The California Office of Legislative Analysis has determined that their proposals are too costly and complicated. Edward Fong in his excellent California Globe article reports that the estimated cost of the regulation and enforcement is \$7 billion to save 444,000-acre feet per year of water, which is about the same cost as desalinating the additional water.

Have you heard about the curious career of Julie Su? She was the California Labor Secretary in 2020 when our legislature and governor attacked independent contractors with **AB 5**. The outrage over the harm caused by the law and her enforcement led to **AB 2257** and **Proposition 22** which exempted many job classifications. \$32 billion of pandemic-related unemployment insurance fraud was allowed during her tenure. She was rewarded

with confirmation by the US Senate as the United States Deputy Secretary of Labor in 2021. She has been acting United States Secretary of Labor for the last 10 months. She was renominated for this position by President Biden on January 9th and on January 10th she published new rules for free-lancers in the Federal Register that would supersede **AB 2257** and **Proposition 22**. The Pacific Legal Foundation is suing Julie Su arguing that the new rules are vague and arbitrary. Louisiana Senator Bill Cassidy promises to introduce a resolution to repeal the rule when it becomes public and takes effect on March 11.






