The study of history gives perspective on our present world. Consider the events leading to the American Revolution. During the late 1760s and early 1770s, relations between Great Britain and her American colonies had grown steadily worse. In April 1775 they erupted into the battles of Lexington and Concord and sparked the Revolutionary War.

The events of April 19, 1775, rocked the world of the colonists. It would not be until sixty-three years later Ralph Waldo Emerson would declare the battle to be the "shot heard round the world," but it was evident to all who survived the day that something fundamental in the world had changed. Unlike previous incidents, such as the Boston Massacre, for the first time British and American forces had fought and killed one another. Few, if any, could foresee it would take eight years until the signing of the Treaty of Paris (1783) to finally settle the matter of American independence from Great Britain.

One lesson of April 19, 1775, is to take heart from the experiences of our ancestors. Out of their struggles came "a new nation, conceived in liberty." Our present challenges are real, but let us not imagine they are unprecedented. Rather, let us take courage from the example of those who came before us.

## **Legislative Report**

#### Saving or resources for China?

In 2019 the city of Berkeley banned natural gas in new construction. Many California cities subsequently passed similar ordinances. Gas stoves are preferred by restaurants because they heat up and cool down more quickly, give greater temperature control, work with a greater variety of cookware, and are easier and less expensive to maintain. The California Restaurant Association filed a lawsuit against the city of Berkeley and on April 17 the Ninth US Federal Circuit Court of Appeals ruled in their favor citing a conflict with federal law. The Energy Policy and Conservation Act of 1975 prevents local regulations from impacting the energy use of natural gas appliances. If this argument stands, then the Bay Area Air Quality Management District's phasing out of gas water heaters and gas furnaces, using nitrous oxide emission restrictions for "health reasons," also conflicts with federal law. Unfortunately, gas appliances are also being attacked at the federal level by Biden's Energy Secretary Jennifer Granholm using energy efficiency regulations. The pervasive and relentless enemies of economic freedom fight on many fronts.

As noted by Kathy Grimes of the California Globe, California sits on the Monterey Shale Formation located along the Western side of the San Joaquin Valley. This is 2/3 of the US shale oil reserves. California, instead of developing this natural resource, imports 75% of its oil and has only 11 refineries. To further hamper the oil industry, Governor Newsom and our Democrat State Legislature approved SB X12, which allows the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission to set a maximum gross gasoline refining margin and increases a variety of reporting requirements. A new bureaucracy called the Division of Petroleum Market Oversight, whose director is appointed by the governor (with senate approval) and who reports directly to the governor, was also created by this law. Opponents of the 2022 law SB 1137, which places new restrictions on oil drilling for "health reasons," gathered enough signatures to place a referendum on the 2024 ballot.

The organizer of Tiananmen Square, Chinese General Chi Haotian, in a 2003 speech declares that China needs to take over the less polluted land of the US to ensure the survival of the 90 million members of the Chinese Communist Party and their control over the Chinese people. He argues for eliminating the US population using biowarfare or other non-nuclear means. Are our corrupt leaders preserving the environment and natural resources for the Chinese Communist Party?

Oppose 659 – Cancer Prevention – the bill was amended - HPV Vaccine Mandate was Dropped! - Thanks to thousands of letters and phone calls, the bill was amended several times: The HPV Gardasil vaccine mandate was dropped first for 8<sup>th</sup> grade girls, but then added for 21-year-old college-age girls. They would have not been allowed to attend college without this vaccine. But the mandate for them has now also been dropped. Many colleges and universities were calling in expressing their opposition, saying such a mandate would affect the enrollment of girls in college.

We are still opposed to this bill, however, because of the language of "expected" that is now being used and that boys are also now to receive it. It now reads that all K-12 and college-age "students" are "expected" to receive the HPV vaccine. The HPV vaccine was supposed to prevent cancer in the cervix. Boys don't have a cervix. There is absolutely no proof that it ever did prevent cancer. It was just a way to promote the vaccine. Now with the word "expected" some parents might think it is necessary for their children to receive it.

Support - AB 1314 – Gender Identity – Parent Notification. This bill was never allowed to be heard by the Education Committee. The chairman, Al Muratsuchi (D), would never give it a hearing date. Its authors, Bill Essayli (R) from Riverside County and James Gallagher (R) from Yuba City - believes this is a very important bill that would help parents to feel like the schools are actually there to support them not to fight against them. The bill states that when a child is considering such an important decision as to change his/her gender that will affect him/her the rest of their lives that the parents be notified about this (within 72 hours), by the school, not keep it a secret from them, as is presently going on in many schools.

Since the bill was never allowed to be heard or voted on, Essayli believes the bill is not dead. He is asking for parents to just bypass the state legislators and go right to your school boards and get them to form a firm policy about this issue supporting parents' rights to be informed. Gallagher said in a statement posted on Facebook. "This decision confirms there are two fundamentally different views of education: Republicans want to empower parents to be involved with their children's upbringing and education, while Democrats see parents as a threat to be isolated and ignored."

**Muratsuchi called the bill "bad policy**," arguing that giving it a hearing would provide a "forum for increasingly hateful rhetoric targeting LGBTQ youth." (LA Times, April 11, 2023)

We are still urging people to write to Maratsuchi and his committee urging them to allow the bill to be heard in at least one committee. He cannot say the bill is dead, when it has not even been allowed to be heard. The CFRW website encourages us to send a letter to each of the education committee members asking for the bill to be heard. Oppose SB 665 - Minors: Consent to Mental Health Services — by Wendy Carrillo (D) - All children age 12 and older can decide for themselves if they need mental health services, without any parents' notification or approval. It is through the "mental health" counselors that so much of the gender confusion is being promoted. The power of suggestion is used on these kids. Often, the way the child answers the mental health screening questions can lead to them being taken out of their homes and being placed in group homes. There is the risk of adult predators in these group homes. The schools are turning the students against their parents and making the students feel that their parents are the enemy. This bill could also affect home schooled children.

<u>Oppose AB 1120</u> – Would require schools to allow for "universal" mental health screening for students from 6<sup>th</sup> grade through 12.

**Oppose AB 957 - Family law: Gender Identity** - by Lori Wilson (D) Livermore and Scott Weiner (D) San Francisco - A judge must "strongly affirm" that a transgendering child will only be allowed

to stay with the parent who supports him in his transition. The parent who refuses to support him will have all rights to be with the child removed. Has passed all of its committees.

Support SB 292 and SCA 5 – Education Choice Bill and Constitution Amendment by Shannon Grove: Senate Bill 292 and Senate Constitutional Amendment 5 are companion measures that establish the California Education Savings Account Act of 2024. This creates an individualized approach to K-12 education by allowing parents to choose what accredited school best suits their child's needs and have the student's share of Proposition 98 funding follow them. Any unused funds can be saved from year-to-year and used to pay for college or vocational training upon graduation from high school. This creates more choice for parents and students. The bill made it into one committee hearing


